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DBE's FUNCTION

The work of the DBE is set out in the [Diocesan Boards of Education Measure \(2021\)](#)

The Measure sets out the functions of board:

The DBE for each diocese must—

1. promote or assist in the promotion of education in the diocese that is consistent with the faith and practice of the Church of England;
2. promote or assist in the promotion of religious education and religious worship in schools in the diocese;
3. promote or assist in the promotion of church schools in the diocese;
4. promote co-operation between itself and other persons concerned with education in the diocese.

The Diocesan Bishop continues to have responsibility for appointing a Diocesan Director of Education (DDE) in consultation with the DBE. The DDE is the DBE's Company Secretary but is not a member of the DBE and may not vote.

The DBE has wide-ranging responsibilities in respect of providing advice on any matter relating to church schools. There are a number of situations in which the DBE's advice must be sought, e.g. admissions. Those receiving the DBE's advice must have due regard to it.

The DBE's consent is required in a range of situations, e.g. converting to an academy or the repair/alteration of church school premises.

The Local Authority must consult with the DBE in relation to the standing advisory council for religious education.

Under certain circumstances, the DBE may issue directions, e.g. to a governing body if there are concerns about the quality of RE or Collective Worship.

The DBE may require information to be provided by governing bodies in order to carry out its duties.

The DBE must have due regard to advice from the Archbishops' Council, including for safeguarding.

The DBE must report to Diocesan Synod annually. [Diocesan Board of Education](#)

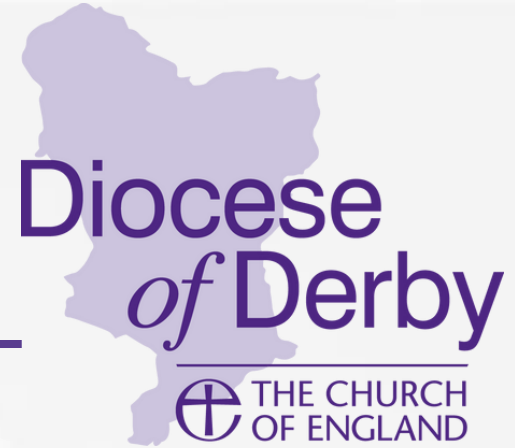

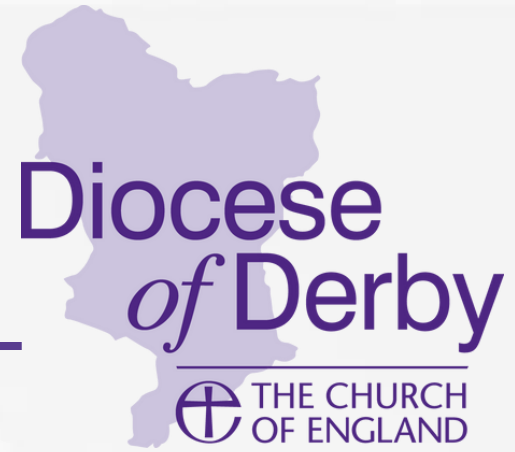
The new guidance, to be entitled 'Tackling homophobic, biphobic and transphobic bullying,' is the first of a new suite of resources and will come into effect from September 2024 after a consultation period.

This suite, named 'Flourishing for All: Anti-bullying guidance for Church of England schools,' will expand with additional sections in the coming months.

In total, five resources will address bullying based on race, special educational needs or disability, religion or belief, and sexist bullying or sexual harassment, alongside the anti-HBT bullying guidance.

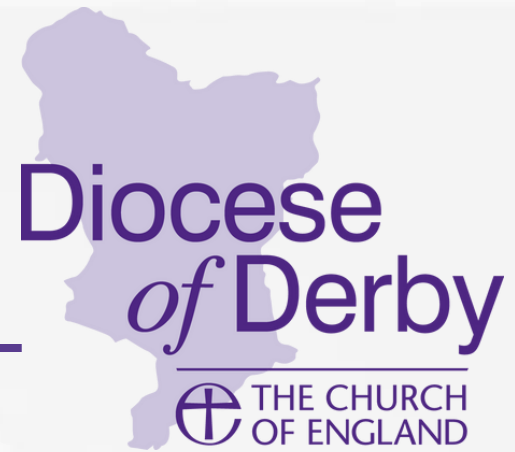


Church of England and ABY Follow The Star Calm and Bright

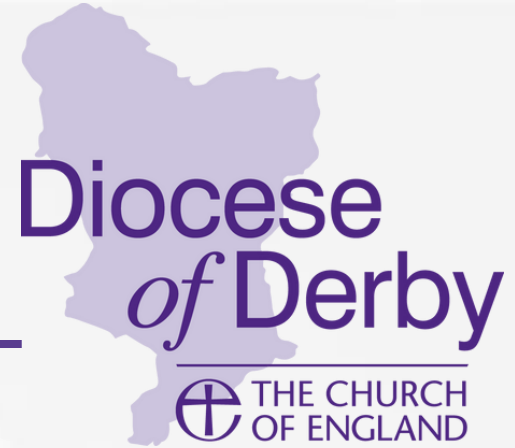

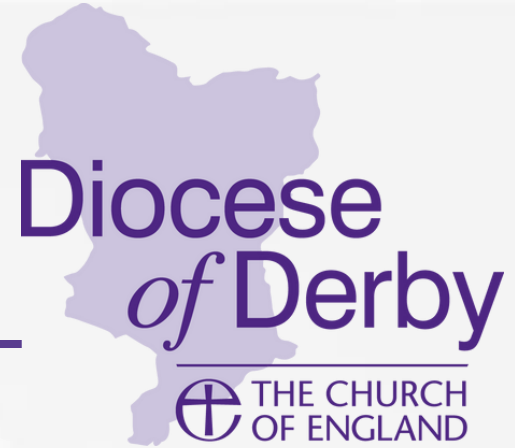

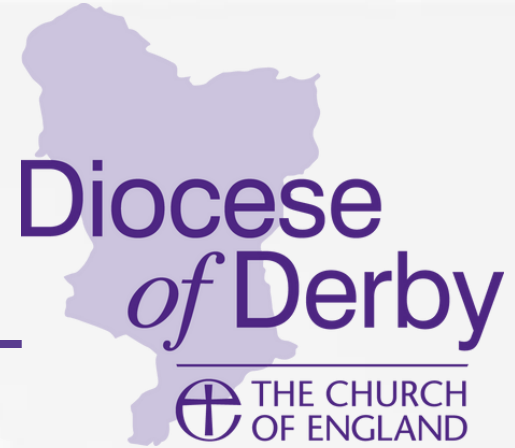
